### **Mental Health Services Available**

#### **What is Tele-practice or Virtual Care?**

Tele-practice or Virtual Care is the remote delivery of a range of health and mental health services using telecommunications technology.

In the context of the novel coronavirus, Virtual Care allows continued care while minimizing the potential spread of the virus. It allows clients to access services without attending a clinic. Appropriateness of tele-practices/virtual care are assessed and in-person care is assessed on a case-by-case basis.

#### **Regional Community Counselling Services**

NTHSSA has transitioned in-person counselling services to telephone- based services in each region.

Wellness Workers, Mental Health and Addictions Counsellors, Child-Youth and Family Counsellors, and Child Youth Care Counsellors are available by telephone to provide a wide range of services to children, youth, families and elders during this challenging and uncertain time for our communities.

Telephone-based services include (and are not limited to):

- \* Individual counselling
- Crisis counselling
- Caregiver/Parental and Family-based counselling
- \* Supportive counselling
- \* Wellness Checks
- Psychological First Aid

#### **Opioid Program**

Shawna Gilmour RN is the Territorial Opioid Program Case Manager. She will be working remotely and will continue to provide assistance with case management and service coordination across the territory for OAT clients.

The Opioid Maintenance Therapy Program staff have augmented services for people in the territory who are currently prescribed opioid agonist therapy (OAT, i.e. Suboxone, methadone, kadian, etc.) or who may enter or return to the program during the pandemic response OMTP physicians in Yellowknife remain available for consultation with community based prescribers, or for prescribing via telehealth in communities who do not have a physician available.

#### **YK Primary Care**

Mental Health Nursing staff are transitioning clients to telephone-based services. All outpatient psychiatry services have transitioned to telephone-based or virtual care.

Resources will be transitioned to Stanton hospital to operate injection clinics.

#### **In-Patient Psychiatric Services**

In-patient Psychiatry continues to offer acute services. Group programing has been suspended to promote social distancing and meal delivery services had adapted to promote social distancing.

Visitors are currently limited to 1 per patient.
